Division 3 rules for Construction http://osha.oregon.gov/OSHARules/div3/div3P.pdf#page=11

These are the primary rules for construction activities related to the 811 program.

Construction activities means: engaged in construction work, including demolition, blasting and use of explosives, and power transmission distribution and maintenance work.

29 CFR 1926.651(b)(1) The estimated location of underground utility installations, such as sewer, telephone, fuel, electric, water lines, or any other underground installations that reasonably may be expected to be encountered during excavation work, were not determined prior to opening an excavation:

29 CFR 1926.651(b)(3) When excavation operations approach the estimated location of underground installations, the exact location of the installations shall be determined by safe and acceptable means.

29 CFR 1926.651(b)(4) While the excavation is open, underground installations shall be protected, supported or removed as necessary to safeguard employees.

29 CFR 1926.21(b)(2): The employer did not instruct each employee in the recognition and avoidance of unsafe condition(s) and the regulation(s) applicable to his work environment to control or eliminate any hazard(s) or other exposure to illness or injury:

437-001-0760 Rules for all Workplaces

- 1. Employers' Responsibilities.
 - (a) The employer must see that workers are <u>properly instructed</u> and <u>supervised</u> in the <u>safe operation of any machinery, tools, equipment, process, or practice</u> that they are authorized to use or apply.
 - (b) The employer *must take all reasonable means* to require employees:
 - (A) To work and act in a safe and healthful manner;
 (C) To use all means and methods, including but not limited to, ladders, scaffolds, guardrails, machine guards, safety belts and lifelines, that are necessary to safely accomplish all work where employees are exposed to a hazard.

Definition of employer and employee

Employer means a person engaged in a business affecting commerce who has employees, but does not include the United States or any State or political subdivision of a State;

Employee means an employee of an employer who is employed in a business of his employer which affects commerce;
