MOU with OPUC

May 12, 2016

Interagency Agreement between the Oregon Public Utility Commission and the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services -Occupational Safety and Health Division (Oregon OSHA)

1. Purpose

This agreement is entered into between the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) and the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services, Occupational Safety and Health Division (Oregon OSHA) for the purposes of outlining the responsibilities and activities to be performed by each agency pursuant to its authority to investigate complaints or incidents and hazardous material hazards. This agreement is intended to promote cooperative efforts between OPUC and Oregon OSHA, and effective regulation of

Roles and Authorities

Under ORS 757 the OPUC utility program is responsible for developing and enforcing safety standards for electric, natural gas and petroleum products (hazardous materials). Under ORS 654, and as the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA's) designee, Oregon OSHA is responsible for protecting workers in the State of Oregon. Workplace regulations are implemented and enforced by

A. Referrals

8.

1. OPUC may refer to Oregon OSHA enforcement situations involving worker exposures to hazards and possible violations of laws or regulations enforced by Oregon OSHA.

2. Oregon OSHA may refer to OPUC enforcement and assistance situations involving safety standards and possible violations of laws and regulations enforced by OPUC.

3. Referrals will occur as soon as practicable, and may be accomplished in person, by telephone, by FAX, by email, or by mail. See Appendix A for Contact Information.

Common Investigations or Inspections

1. When inspecting or responding to a complaint relating to the same project or situation, OPUC and Oregon OSHA will assist each other, to the extent possible and allowed by law, by sharing Information regarding probable violations of worker safety and safety standards.

Excavation means any man-made cut, cavity, trench, or depression in an earth surface, formed by earth removal.

OUNC / OAR 952-001-0010(8)=

(8) "Excavation" means any operation in which earth, rock or other material on or below the ground is moved or otherwise displaced by any means, except sidewalk, road and ditch maintenance less than 12 inches in depth that does not lower the original grade or original ditch flow line. "Excavation" does not include the tilling of soil for agricultural purposes conducted on private property that is not within the boundaries of a recorded right-of-way or easement for underground facilities.
