Be sure to send your Meeting Minutes or Newsletters to Kitty O'Keefe regularly to be uploaded to the website.

It should be the goal of every UCC to promote 811 within their communities with the funds they have every year. Your yearly dues and Assistance money is for this purpose. The OUNC provides the Assistance money with the expectation that all of it is used every year, and has requested reports on the distributions.

In transparency, each Council received \$2,000 minus the dues that are required for that Council. The dues are calculated on the population census for each council based on the most recent census. Any Additional Assistance money that is requested is approved on a case by case basis, and tracked for reporting purposes.

We hope you will continue to spread our Dig Safely message across your areas, and are looking for more ways to share opportunities for outreach across lines throughout the state.
