Damages / Near Misses: Doug reported no damages in our area; however, there were two in Walla Walla and one in Enterprise. Jeff reported irrigation lines being damaged in the landscape areas at the I-84 interchange exits; Ron reported a 1/2" service line and a 2" main was dug into on NW 23rd Street, Pendleton; also he found someone pounding rods in the parking lot by Grocery Outlet, Pendleton, for the 4th of July firework sales tent without calling for locates. 5. P & E Report (Publicity & Education) / Upcoming Events / Meetings: Ron met with Peter of Corvallis Productions, LLC regarding hammering the tent pegs in the parking lot and provided the Dig Law handbook, explained the 811 rules and gave out SWAG as reminders. Ron also mentioned it's the 20th Anniversary of the Olympic Pipeline explosion that occurred in Bellingham, Washington, at Whatcom Falls Park on June 10, 1999 and killed three children. This explosion was as a result of a series of failures, not just a single error, due to

improperly trained employees, a faulty computer SCADA system and a pressure relief valve. Also, in 1994, five years prior to the accident, a construction crew working on behalf of the City of Bellingham damaged the pipeline while constructing the City's water treatment plant and Olympic Pipeline had failed to find or report the damage. This incident and its aftermath are being talked about nationwide to promote public awareness and education. As a result, CNG has to inspect every line and be present during construction and report it to the Federal government. Jutta received a letter from City of Pendleton Parks and Recreation Department regarding sponsoring another Movie in the Park this year for \$400. Tim made a motion to approve; Jeff seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously. Hector mentioned he is still working on finding out more information from the City of Pasco regarding who painted the 811 logo on their water tower. The City of Hermiston is currently constructing a new tower at E Punkin Center Road and NE 10th Street and the City of Pendleton is planning on a new water tower at their airport as well. Ron mentioned the State Council would probably contribute to this as well if we request additional funds for publicity. 6.
